Language	<p><i>Point!</i> Get into the habit of noticing the things that your toddler is pointing at, then tell them what they're pointing at. For example, if your toddler points at a book, tell them "book"</p>	<p><i>Pictures</i> Show your toddler some pictures of family and friends, and have them try to learn some names.</p>	<p><i>Where is "name"?</i> Building up from yesterday's lesson, try to scatter some pictures, and ask your toddler questions like "where is mom?" "where is dad?" to learn names and face recognition.</p>	<p><i>Waving Hello and Goodbye</i> Associate words and movements by waving hello and goodbye to family.</p>	<p><i>Pets</i> If you have pets, this could be a great way to recognize the sound and names of pets. If not, you can show pictures of some animals and search up animal sounds online. Maybe even give them imaginary names.</p>
Songs	<p><i>"Who Took the Cookie?"</i> Sing songs that use names to connect a name to a person.</p>	<p><i>"Where is the baby nose?"</i> A perfect song to get your toddler familiar with the names of body parts.</p>	<p><i>"Ten Little Fingers"</i> A very fun and interactive song that will have your toddler moving their fingers and learning new words.</p>	<p><i>"Ten Little Monkeys"</i> Another fun song to sing with your toddler that exposes them to easy math and the concept of less and more.</p>	<p><i>"Wheels On The Bus"</i> Some more hand movements along to a classic tune.</p>
Motor	<p><i>Treasure Hunt</i> Hide a favorite toy under some blankets or pillows, and</p>	<p><i>Ball Rolling</i> Take turns rolling a softball back and forth to improve hand-eye</p>	<p><i>Water Play</i> Let your toddler feel and play in the water.
